Enroll at a regionally accredited community college or four-year university

Though App State keeps a history of how coursework from other four-year institutions transfer, transferring coursework from a community college is often most efficient. App State has already mapped out how specific courses transfer from every North Carolina community college. Wherever you choose to attend, apply early to make sure you have the best selection of courses.

How to select courses

The major you pursue at App State will determine what courses you take as early as your first semester so having a major or two in mind is important. Explore majors at appstate.edu/majors. Each major will have a program of study that will show you what courses are required. Check out the Transfer Course Equivalency Search to see how courses transfer to App State from the institution you plan to attend. transfer.appstate.edu/credit

If you are attending a North Carolina community college, the courses in the chart below are guaranteed to transfer into our general education program if you earn a C or better. This is the best route to take if you are undecided about your major.

Make a plan

After reviewing these resources, you'll be well equipped to make a preliminary plan. Look into what courses are offered at the institution you are planning to attend before transferring to App State – a schedule should be posted on the institution's website. Create a possible course schedule that meets App State's general education or degree requirements. Review an example below of a plan to attend a semester at an NC Community College.

Here are a few tips to consider when building your schedule:

- App State's General Education requirement includes four semester hours of math and eight semester hours of science courses. Some community college or four-year university courses are only three semester hours.
- Some majors require specific courses that can complete both degree and General Education requirements. Remember to check the major's program of study and NCCC Transfer Guide.
- If you change your path and complete your associate degree before transferring to App State, our Transfer Guides (BDPs) give you exactly what classes you need for your major. <u>transfer.appstate.edu/transferguides</u>



Meet with an academic advisor

This is a crucial step that will ensure a smooth transition. If you attend a NC community college, your academic advisor there will help ensure that all of your courses transfer to App State. If you have any questions or attend an institution that is not a NC community college, be sure to set up an appointment with the Transfer Transition Advisor in Transfer Admissions & Engagement at ugrad.appstate.edu/portal/otsoneonones to talk about your plan.



Take courses and transfer credit

Take your classes, successfully complete your college courses with a C or better, and have your official final transcript sent to App State to processing@appstate.edu as soon as your final grades post at the end of the semester. We will need your final transcript before Orientation. In the meantime, you should also notify the Office of Admissions in your MyMountaineer Portal of any courses you are in progress of taking before you enroll at App State. Only credits earned, not grades, will transfer and appear on your App State transcript.
